Nilekani left Infosys to head the UIDAI in July 2009. In five years, Aadhaar has transformed India's approach to socio-economic justice and equity, and became the lynchpin to the government's welfare programmes that seek to achieve these goals. It also set the stage for an efficient and transparent mechanism to monitor government programmes, which is crucial to cut waste and slippage in order to maintain fiscal prudence at the national level.
