There be those of lesser breeds than such leaders in art and criticism who, having once restated these principles- sometimes without credit-have come thereafter to regard them as their own. Of course, their claims to proprietary rights in these many truisms are at best about as valid as would be an assertion of copyright on the multiplication table, announced by the author of a new elementary arithmetic. No acknowledgment can be due to such compilers. In a preliminary way, it will be well to survey quickly some of the pretty generally acknowledged foundation theories first formulated by the great trail-blazers of dramatic art. Action is the soul of tragedy, or of drama generally, asserted Aristotle. This action means a conflict of wills, Hegel and others hinted, and Brunetiere succinctly declared. Drama deals with the cruces of existence when duty and inclination come to the grapple, Stevenson repeated. Periods of great national vitality have accordingly given birth to the greatest drama, added Sarcey- and others. That the theatre is a place of illusion, based on many conventions, is an obvious matter which dozens of critics have emphasized. Dramatic composition, like every other sort, must recognize Spencer's doctrine of the economy of attention. Stage dialogue, for instance, must be divested of the tautologies of real life...."
